Our native plants are organized into 3 large groups by **MINIMUM Light Requirement**:

Full Sun (>6 hrs) **Partial Shade** (4-6 hrs) **Shade** (<4 hrs)



Each large group is also divided into 3 smaller subgroups by **MAXIMUM Water Tolerance**:

Well-Drained (soil stays dry) **Moist** (damp days after rain) **Wet** (saturated for weeks)



Within each of the resulting 9 subgroups, plants are arranged by **MATURE Height**.

Look for the **Card** hanging near each plant. It has a picture of the native plant, information about its unique growth habit and the yellow & blue icons. The plant's **Height (H) x Width (W)** at maturity, **Bloom Month & Color** and special abbreviations for **Value to Wildlife** are defined below.

BF=Bird Food **HN**=Hummingbird Nectar **BN**=Butterfly Nectar **HP**=Host Plant for Butterflies

Are You Ready to Check Out?

1. Proceed to Check-Out Station around the front of the building.
2. Pick up Nature's Way Compost & Mulch – Only \$10 per bag.
3. Hand this sheet to a Volunteer who will apply barcode stickers to this sheet.
4. Next, take this barcode sticker sheet to our Nature Shop for payment.
5. After payment, a Volunteer will help you load your vehicle.
